You are invited to the 18th annual Georgia Chamber Music Retreat on the beautiful University of North Georgia campus in scenic mountain country in Georgia. From Friday evening until Sunday afternoon, about 60 musicians gather for a spring weekend of chamber music, food, and fun. Please join us this year.

The weekend begins with dinner on Friday, June 12th, 2019 and ends on Sunday afternoon, June 14th. **Once you have arrived, you are expected to stay for the entire weekend.** During the weekend, our main focus is on sight-reading music in small chamber ensembles. This is not a workshop: No instruction is offered and practicing is highly discouraged. ☺ We play for the joy of making music together and to get away from teaching, gigging, or simply leading our lives. The attendees are usually a mix of amateur and professional musicians and teachers.

University of North Georgia is an immaculately kept and scenic military school nestled in the Northwest Georgia mountains in the heart of Dahlonega, Georgia. Dahlonega is a quaint mountain town filled with shops, theaters, and good food. The area is famous for its natural beauty, hiking trails, and waterfalls.

Bring your instrument(s), casual clothes, recreational equipment (bicycles, etc.) and any chamber music you have access to (don't worry if it is not for your instrument). To insure that we have an appropriate mix of instruments, only the first people who accept the invitation will be able to attend. Those who attended last year get the first opportunity to return, so you may be placed on a waiting list until February 1st, when previous attendees must decide. **Many sections fill quickly.** Be sure to let us know as soon as possible whether or not you would like to come. When a spot is available, we will ask for a deposit to hold it.

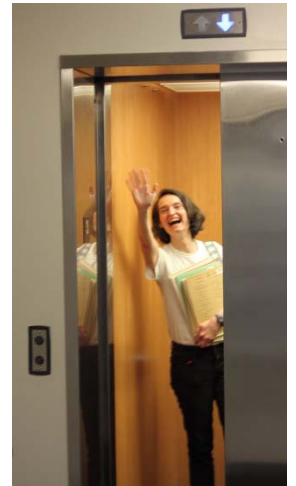
We continue to keep the cost of the retreat low to make it more affordable, especially for practicing musicians who might not otherwise afford to get away. The cost of the weekend is \$235 per person double occupancy (or \$295 per person single occupancy), which includes two nights plus six meals. See *Accommodations* on the next page. If you accept this invitation, please send a \$40 deposit to the address below **before Monday, March 9, 2020.** The deposit is non-refundable. The remainder of your cost for the weekend is due three weeks prior to the event (Friday, May 22). No profit is made on the retreat.

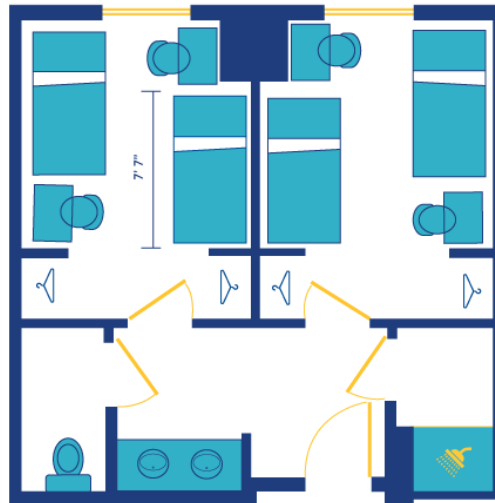


The Commons Building



Accommodations

Accommodations are in the new Commons building (same as two years ago). Rooms are in suites of two private rooms (doubles or singles) with a shared bathroom. There is a common area on each floor with fridges and stoves.

Six meals are included (Friday dinner through Sunday lunch). Dining is in the nearby Dining Hall which has a full-time deli, salad bar, wood-fired pizza oven, and Mongolian grill, plus hot meals which rotate.

Special dietary restrictions can be accommodated with advanced notice.
